Principal's Message

Dear Families,
Welcome to Term 2. I would like to thank Mr Hall and Mrs Jones who were in the role as Acting Principal while I was away. During this time, I have heard amazing feedback in relation to the successful swimming carnival and meaningful Holy Week celebrations which highlighted the significance of the Easter story in our culture as a Catholic School.



Term 2 is starting with just as much rigour. Our continuing focus is to strengthen our partnership with both campus communities and the wider communities of Thursday and Hammond Island.

We are very aware that at this stage of the school's development, we are moving forward with creating a contemporary learning environment which supports the needs of our students, staff and families. Decision making can be quite difficult at times, even challenging. Principal's Message continued

Each group will be an advisory group to the school leadership team and work collaboratively with community elders and community representatives, staff groups and student groups who are working on the same focus.

If you would like to be actively involved in one of these areas, please nominate your chosen area and complete the form and return to the office.

Our aim is to make decisions that highlight our history, culture, reflect the present and lead us into providing a high quality Catholic learning environment for future generations of children and families of the Torres Strait Island Communities.

I would also like to seek your feedback on a proposal that we have for modifying the play areas for the senior students in Years 3-6.

A summary of the current situation:

Students in Year 3 – 6 are playing down on the bottom level after eating at the tuckshop area.

Handball has become a popular game with the senior students.

Students have to walk from the bottom area unattended to go to the toilet during play time and often stay up in this area.

Feedback from some year levels is that they would prefer to play in the top area, especially Year 3 students.

Some senior students go to the library at lunch time.

Other groups that occur at lunch time for senior students on the upper level are choir, chess, drama, math's club and guitar lessons.

There is no access to any water on the bottom level.

Children have access to a grassed area and a concrete area.

Trees provide shade to the students in parts of the lower area.

Children walk down three flights of stairs to get to and from the area.

The school bell is not heard from the bottom area and one teacher is on duty.

Immediate first aid is difficult to respond to in a timely manner.

The Diocese of Cairns are also planning building works and improvement of the Sacred Heart Mission Hall which will hopefully take place in Term 2.

We would like to propose that the following change is trialled, based on your feedback and support for Term 2:

- All students in Year 3-6 remain on the top level of the school during play time.
- Senior students are able to access toilets, water (new chiller fountains have been ordered and await delivery and installation) the library and a variety of extra curricula groups offered during the week.
- Students are able to access staff and first aid treatment in a quicker manner when necessary.
- Students who are not part of the extra curricula groups will play in the front covered area where effective supervision will be more easily achieved in a smaller space.
- Students will be able to play handball on painted 6 and 4 square courts that will be painted in the covered area.
- Students who choose to sit around and talk to friends are able to do this.
- Students will be able to return to their classrooms in a more orderly manner under greater supervision and with increased access to adult supervision due to not walking up and down three flights of stairs.
- During wet and hot weather, students will continue to be able to access their normal play routine in the senior year levels with minimal impact.
- We believe that this will be beneficial in achieving greater harmony amongst the students of our school.

We would like to seek your feedback on trialling this for Term 2 and will also seek feedback from our student community.

The senior students will not be playing with the younger children during these times, however the Year 3 students may be provided with the option.

Please feel free to identify your preference and provide a comment if you would like on the form provided and return to the office by the end of next week.

Take care and I look forward to working in partnership with our school community and Torres Strait Community to continue to provide a school that meets the needs of our students and families.

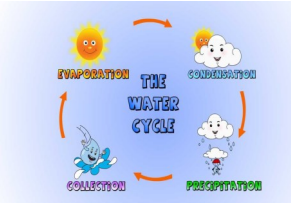

Year 5 & 6 News - Week 2

Welcome back to term 2, and what a busy term it looks like being. English and particularly writing will be a major focus this term and we have a couple of projects on the boil. First off, we will be writing a fishing guide to the Torres Strait. With any luck, this might even get published in a fishing magazine, so keep your fingers crossed for us please. In class, we will be looking to improve the structure of our writing, with a particular emphasis on correctly formed paragraphs.



Overall, our theme for this term is "Everything Matters". Not surprisingly, in science we will be learning about matter and the water cycle. Also, the students will learn how to design, conduct and report on a scientific investigation.

In Maths, the first half of the term will be algebra, while the rest of the term will concentrate on fractions, decimals and percentages.

In technology, we will be coding this term. The students will get to learn some simple programming language and if time and circumstances permit, we may even attempt to build a simple website.

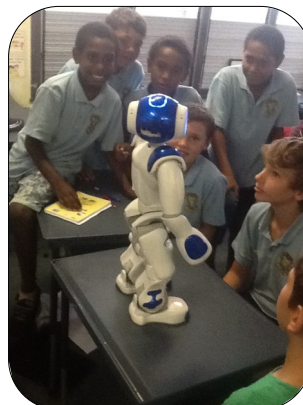
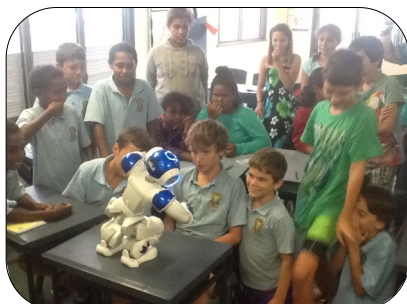
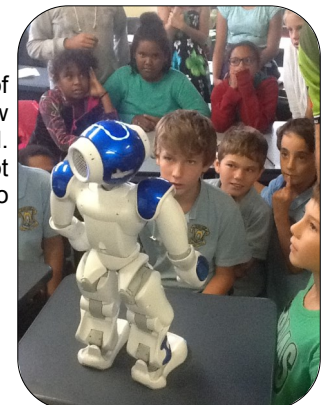
